Mass Customization for Graduate Schools: Building Workflows and Processes to Gain Efficiencies

Graduate Programs require a lot of customization. Each program has different requirements, different admission cycles, and different ways of reviewing applications. Even beyond admissions, graduate schools have unique needs such as managing graduate assistantships across programs and colleges and managing the dissertation/thesis process. This presentation will specifically focus on how West Chester University has used Slate to capitalize on these efficiencies. Learn how the Graduate School has utilized Slate to create more efficient processes for admissions, academic operations including graduate assistantship contracts, awarding conference stipends to current students, deploying academic standing letters, refined the process for dissertation/thesis acceptances and streamlined the process for gathering requests for transfer credits. This session will showcase these different projects in showing all the facets of how to plan for implementing to the boots on the ground execution. Starting with the discovery conversations, how to get stakeholder buy-in, this session will discuss project management and working collaboratively with faculty and colleagues across departments. Planning and careful forethought of how to organize a Slate instance for these types of operational efficiencies will be covered including naming conventions, building out data containers, designing what fields and prompt structure will be necessary. Complex form creation has been critical in these projects and will be covered including creating tabs, using merge fields, and enabling access to the forms for both the student and the administrative support behind the scenes. The use of workflows and portal views and configurable joins queries will be reviewed as they pertain to accessing the data and streamlining the

processing of the student data for the end goals. Communications and deliver will be touched on as it impacts the student's experience and better realizes huge wins across the University for using Slate beyond admissions. Finally, the creation of documents using the File Editor for archiving documents to the University's official repository, Onbase will be demonstrated. From beginning to end, this session will give participants the tools to comprehensively plot out how to implement a custom solution for a program or optimizing a process.
